Kamakura (鎌倉)

Kamakura is a seaside city south of Tokyo. Kamakura used to be the capital during the Kamakura period, where the Kamakura Shogunate resided. Today, Kamakura is a popular travel destination famed for its historic temples, shrines and many seasonal festivals.

Great Buddha of Kamakura (鎌倉大仏)

Kotoku-in is a Buddhist temple of the Jodo sect and famous for its Amida Buddha. It was originally built in 1243 as an indoor statue. A tsunami in the 15th-century destroyed the temple and the statue has remained outdoors since. The statue measures 13.35 metres (43.8 ft) tall and weighs approximately 103 tons.



Tsurugaoka Hachimangu (鶴岡八幡宮)

Tsurugaoka Hachimangu was opened in 1063 and relocated to its present location in 1180. The current building was built in 1818 and is also known as a historic building with a history of more than 200 years.

Hase-dera Temple (長谷寺)

Hase-dera Temple is a Buddhist temple, commonly called the Hase-kannon. It is famous for housing a massive wooden statue of kannon. Also, Hase-dera temple lies on a hillside overlooking Kamakura which is blessed with one of the best views of the city.









Zazen (座禅): Zazen means sitting meditation. It is part of the Zen Buddhist tradition. The goal is to give insight into one's true nature of being via meditation. Sessions are held free of charge at Kenchoji Temple and Engakuji Temple. It's a popular event for self improvement.
